Sunday May 31

At 1:15 a.m. patrol officers located 4 juveniles walking in the 300 block of Water Street, Conneaut Lake Borough, in violation of the borough curfew ordinance. The males were returned to a residence in the borough and verbal warnings were issued.

At 2:30 a.m. officers were dispatched to the area of Shady Avenue, Conneaut Lake Borough, for the report of explosions in the area. After an extensive search officers were unable to locate anything.

Monday June 1

At 5:25 a.m. officers were dispatched to State Highway 285 and Church Road, N. Shenango Twp., for the report of a motor vehicle crash. It was learned that Barry Wilson, 54, Titusville was traveling on SR 285 when his vehicle struck a deer in the roadway. There were no injuries and the vehicle was driven from the scene.
